The Burbank Glendale Pasadena Airport Authority oversees the operation of Hollywood Burbank Airport, a medium hub (C-index) airport serving 6 million passengers annually. The Airport Fire Department handles various emergency services, specializing in Aircraft Rescue Firefighting (ARFF).

Pre-Interview:

Candidates who successfully complete a department pre-interview will receive an invitation to schedule a station tour and oral panel interview in August 2025.

Application Requirements:

- 4 years of municipal, county, state, federal firefighting experience.
- Proof of certifications, EMT and CPR certification.
- Cal-JAC CPAT (Candidate Physical Ability Test) Card must be dated between 07/01/2024 and 07/01/2025.
