Firefighter-Paramedics are assigned to the suppression division and perform a wide variety of "all-risk" tasks including emergency and non-emergency functions. Typical duties include fire suppression; ALS emergency medical services; fire prevention; public service; and public education. Firefighter-Paramedics are typically assigned to an engine, truck or medic company.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- 18 years of age & High School Diploma or equivalent.
- Must be on the FCTC Statewide Eligibility List as of 9/22/18.
- Valid California EMT-P License with a current ACLS & CPR certification.
- Successful completion of the Cal-JAC Candidate Physical Ability Test (CPAT) between 9/23/17-9/22/18.
- One consecutive year of full-time, paid experience as a Paramedic in a primary 911 transporting agency at time of application.
- Possession of a valid California Class C driver's license with the ability to obtain a firefighters endorsement within 18 months of employment.
- Possession of a Firefighter I certification or completion of a Firefighter I academy is highly desirable.

SELECTION PROCESS

- The selection process shall consist of an application review, assessment center/interview panel and a Chief's interview.
- Applicants advancing past the interview process are subject to a background investigation, psychological screening, medical examination and drug screen.
- Candidates who successfully complete the above referenced background components will then be given an opportunity to be evaluated in the field by a District Paramedic Evaluator on a District ambulance. During this time, candidates will be paid on an hourly basis. The District will reasonably accommodate scheduling conflicts.
- Successful candidates will be required to complete a paid Fire Academy which lasts up to 16 weeks.
- Candidates must obtain and maintain accreditation as a Contra Costa County Paramedic.

SALARY AND BENEFITS

\$8,419 - \$10,222 / Month

Inclusive of Fire Retirement Allotment (FRA), FLSA, Holiday and Uniform pay.

The District offers a benefit package that includes medical, dental and vision insurance, vacation and paid sick leave, an employee assistance program, flexible spending account, an optional 457 deferred compensation program, and a selection of voluntary benefits.

The District is a member of the Contra Costa County Employees' Retirement Association (CCCERA). Firefighter-Paramedics are classified as safety members and receive retirement benefits of 3%@50 (Legacy) or 2.7%@57 (PEPRA).

This position is represented by the United Professional Firefighters of Contra Costa County I.A.F.F., Local 1230.

Applicants who are not on the FCTC SEL will not be considered.

THE DISTRICT

The Moraga-Orinda Fire Protection District is a special, independent district that was formed in 1997, when over 80% of the voters affirmatively voted to form the District. The District has six divisions: *Operations, Special Operations, Prevention, Support Services, Training and Administrative Services*. These divisions provide a full-range of services, including emergency, non-emergency, service, prevention, and public education. Full-time suppression personnel are assigned to four engines, one truck, two medic units, and one command unit. There are five (5) fire stations within the district. The District protects Battalion-4 in Central Contra Costa County, encompassing over 42 square miles. The District covers a broad geographic and population base consisting primarily of urban/suburban/semi-rural and rural service areas.
